
Module 3 Overview:

On the following 2 pages, there are classroom "Twitter" templates that can be used to create a bulletin board or used as handouts in the classroom to facilitate a discussion. - Have students write a tweet to the following prompt on the template.
 - A tweet is a short response or comment that consists of 140 characters or less.
